Worship: A definition

Noun

The feeling or expression of reverence and adoration for a deity.

Religious rites or ceremonies, constituting a formal expression of reverence for a deity.

Great admiration or devotion shown towards a person or principle.

Verb

Show reverence and adoration for (a deity).

Take part in a religious ceremony.

Feel great admiration or devotion for.

Origin

Old English weorthscipe 'worthiness, acknowledgement of worth' (worth, -ship).

We are the people of God, and because we are His, we worship.



How can we know the God we worship?

Only as he reveals himself! Through:

Actions – creating, redeeming, judging

Names – the LORD (Yahweh); God Almighty (El

Shaddai); Master, Lord (Adoni)

Images – Father, rock, husband, shepherd

Attributes – holiness, goodness, love, grace, wrath





God as Trinity

The doctrine of the Trinity makes definitive revelation of God possible as he is known in Christ (John 1.18)

The Trinity makes the atonement possible (Hebrews 9.14)

The Trinity shows that God is self-sufficient (Acts 17.25)

The Trinity provides the ultimate model for earthly relationships (1 Cor. 11.3; 12.4-6; Ephesians 4,4-7)



Worship: Principles

Worship in Spirit and in truth (John 4.23-24)

Worship God in the splendour of his holiness (Psalm 29.1-2)

Worship with humility, reverence and awe (Psalm 95.6-7, Hebrews 12.28)

Worship with our whole selves (Romans 12.1)

Worship now in anticipation of the worship in the age to come (Revelation 4 and 5)





Worship: Principles
